Job Posting: Haley K-8 Coach-Mentor (Afterschool) Boston Scores School Year 2025-26

About Boston Scores

Boston Scores is an after school program for urban students grades K2-12 that combines soccer with classroom-based poetry, service learning and financial literacy.

Boston Scores promotes leadership, teamwork, commitment and positive self-expression among urban young people. We typically serve 1,400+ students annually on 60 school-based soccer teams across the City of Boston, plus high school and summer programs.

About the Position

Haley K-8 Coach-Mentors work directly with a group of K2-6th grade students to develop their knowledge in:

- Creative Writing
- Civic engagement
- Social-emotional skill building
- Aerobic capacity through soccer and other active activities

Programming hours are Monday – Friday from 2:30 – 5:30pm during the Boston Public School academic year. This position is a full year commitment. The BPS school starts Thursday, September 4, 2025 and ends June 22, 2026

Responsibilities of the Coach-Mentor include:

- Plans and leads academic enrichment and soccer sessions up to five times a week for up to 90 minutes a session for a group of 15-20 students.
- Uses Boston Scores sponsored curricula (Soccer for Success, Power of Poetry and Writing for the Community) as a basis of instruction
- Models our Scores pillars of: ***Teamwork, Leadership and Commitment***
- Prepares students to present final season presentations for grades 4-6th: Poetry Slam in the Fall and Jamboree in the Spring
- Chaperones students for special outings
- Attends all required Boston Scores training sessions
- Administers and collects all pre and post evaluations
- Answers all communication from Boston Scores in a timely manner
- Administers daily attendance
- Submits all work hours through CheckWriters on a weekly basis
- Communicates with parents/guardians as needed

Skills and Qualifications

- Experience working with children ages 5 to 12 (grades K2-6)
- Must have understanding of urban education and youth development
- Experience teaching and/or mentoring youth
- Strong verbal and interpersonal communication skills
- Strong organizational skills
- Must pass a rigorous background check process prior to starting
- Fluency in Spanish, Portuguese or Cape Verdean is a plus but not required

Coach-mentors will earn \$32.50 per hour. Coach-Mentors are paid for training and special events.
